



BEYOND THE CHURCH WALLS

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2026: OUR YEAR OF FRUITFUL LABOUR | 2 Chronicles 15: 7

- “Beyond the church walls” means moving beyond Eden, beyond where all is already good, to extend God's order because God loves order (**Genesis 1:1-29**).
- Spreading God's order in our spheres of influence is our divine purpose. We are created and equipped to extend His influence beyond the church into the world.
- Limiting people to work only within the church sanctuary breeds competition for attention and inevitably leads to church politics.
- If God has made you a king, you have territories to govern so that you can extend His order over your dominion (**Matthew 13:33**).
- God's kings rise through unexpected paths – Joseph through prison, Daniel through captivity. Your current position does not limit your destiny. You are called to influence your platform to advance God's kingdom, transforming lives and extending His order.
- God has made you a priest, a mediator with spiritual territories and invisible armies. We have invisible armies (remember when Elisha's servant saw heavenly hosts in **(2 Kings 6:17)**). Priests exercise authority through spiritual influence, releasing God's resources to accomplish His purposes on earth.
- Every king who seeks to take territory knows he must act with spiritual intelligence, not just natural knowledge. That is why kings have always sought the insight of priests or prophets to gain a spiritual advantage and understand times, seasons, and outcomes beyond human calculation. This priestly guidance ensures that dominion is secured not by strength alone, but by revelation.
- A king acts with intelligence, but a priest is a portal between heaven and earth, receiving and releasing God's purposes. We are called to be both: kings who act and priests who receive, downloading from heaven and executing on earth.

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- The priest sees the heavenlies; the king acts on earth. True authority blends both—revelation guides action, and action fulfils revelation.
- Seeing the heavenlies is not enough; revelation must be acted upon. When kings and priests unite, heaven's purposes manifest on earth, establishing divine order in their territories.
- God's system links revelation and action: the king receives the vision, the priest interprets it, and the king enforces it. Like Joseph and Daniel, kings and priests translate divine insight into earthly action, turning heaven's wisdom into reality.
- When God blessed Adam and Eve, they already had everything they needed. Though they appeared to have nothing, their sufficiency came from God's divine pronouncement.
- Adam and Eve stood naked before God, yet fully blessed. Their blessing, rooted in covenant, carried the provision, authority, and capacity to fulfil their assignment. **Genesis 1:28** shows that God's blessing establishes

identity and sufficiency even before visible resources appear.

- As a human with the power of speech, you can create something from nothing. Speak order into every disorder, aligning your words with God's will.



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- Every territory God has given you may be occupied, but it belongs to you. Declare “Overthrow” and take dominion, not for yourself, but as God's representative (**Ezekiel 21:27**).
- Entering a territory may meet resistance, but this is not merely physical. Business is spiritual. Our mandate is clear: “Occupy till I come,” faithfully advancing His work until He returns (**Luke 19:13**).

- In battle, the priest acts first—dethroning opposition before the king moves. Victory is established spiritually, allowing the king to enter already won battles (**2 Kings 3:15-27**).
- Kingship is needed to invade, maintain, and establish territories. Maintaining and establishing is harder than invading because they require vigilance and effort. A conquered ground does not stay won automatically.
- Every territory has gates with gatekeepers—some visible, some spiritual. They cannot be removed by force; you must either gain their favour or displace them (**1 Corinthians 16:9**).
- Every city has gates guarded by those who came before, setting the trial for all who follow. They test and refine you, ensuring the city's legacy is maintained, not just for you but for future generations.
- The area of your life that feels most challenging, where you face disgrace and struggle, is your throne. It is your territory, your domain, and the place where God has called you to exercise authority and bring order.

- Your platform carries forces that resist change. This is why some people seem fine until they assume power, and they start misbehaving.
- Remember, no matter how strong the opposing forces may be, the Bible declares: “Behold, I give you authority” (**Luke 10:17-19**).
- If you are destined to be a king, prepare yourself for the battle that has already been won.



PRAYER POINTS

1. Father, I take authority over everything that has been running riot in my life.
2. Father, contend with those who contend with me, and save my children. Let justice prevail in their lives, and let those who oppose them face the consequences of their actions.
3. Lord Jesus, I take possession of the territory You have assigned to me.
4. I reject every curse, declaration, or limitation spoken over me, in the name of Jesus.
5. Father, let the handiwork of creation align with Your plan for my life, revealing Your glory daily. Let every spiritual ordinance, limitation, and enemy strategy written against me be dethroned.
