



## THE NON-NEGOTIABLE FOUNDATION OF HEAVEN'S RULE

2026: OUR YEAR OF FRUITFUL LABOUR | 2 Chronicles 15: 7

- For the rule of heaven to be perpetuated consistently in our lives, there are foundational principles that are non-negotiable. These must be firmly established in our personal lives, our communities, and the Church (**Psalm 89:1-37, 38-52**).
- When people violate God's non-negotiable principles, they become broken, conflicting situations begin to happen, and life begins to lose its sense.
- You can't choose what you like when it comes to the things of God. You can't handpick. It is a whole package. Righteousness and justice are the foundation of God's throne (**Psalm 97:1-2; 33:4-5**).
- God's throne is founded upon righteousness and justice. David experienced heaven on earth because he embraced these divine values, ruling his kingdom with righteousness and justice in alignment with God's own rule (**2 Samuel 8:15, AMP**).
- Whenever you encounter a passage of Scripture that appears to contain a conflict or contradiction, the issue is not with God's word; rather, it is with our understanding of it, for "the word of the Lord is right" (**Psalm 33:4-5**).
- There can be no experience of heaven on earth apart from the rule of God. God's rule cannot be established without His throne. And heaven is truly heaven due to the presence of God's throne. (**Isaiah 66:1**).
- Wherever the throne of God is established, heaven is present. In other words, wherever God's throne is central and His rule is fully exercised, the reality of heaven is manifested (**Matthew 5:33-34**).
- David was not the only man who experienced the days of heaven on earth; Abraham also

walked in that reality, enjoying God's abundant blessings and favour throughout his life (**Genesis 24:1, Ephesians 1:3**).



Wherever the throne of God is established, heaven is present. In other words, wherever God's throne is central and His rule is fully exercised, the reality of heaven is manifested (**Matthew 5:33-34**).



- Abraham was blessed in every way. The grace of God was multiplied in his life across many dimensions, and by faith he even saw realities he could not yet possess long before they came to pass (**John 8:56-59**).
- For the fulfilment of God's promises to Abraham, the foundation of righteousness and justice had to be established and sustained in his

descendants from generation to generation (**Genesis 15:1-6; 17:1-2; 18:17-19**).

- God does not require everyone and everything to align before He can rule. He simply needs His people to live righteously, providing a foundation upon which His throne can be established (**Psalms 110:1-3**).
- While righteousness is God's gift to us, it must also find expression in the way we live. Abraham demonstrated this reality by ordering his life according to the righteousness that had been credited to him through faith (**Romans 5:17, 1 John 3:7-10**).
- It is not enough to declare that you are the righteousness of God in Christ Jesus; you must demonstrate it through a life of righteous living. Righteousness must be intentionally practised, for whoever does not practise righteousness is not of God (**1 John 3:7-10**).

- A key indication that we are walking in righteousness is the presence of genuine love. Scripture refers to love as the bond of perfection, binding together all the virtues of a godly life. Righteousness is the nature we receive from God, while holiness is the daily expression of that nature.
- God is a just God. He will never forsake the righteous, nor will He justify the wicked (**Genesis 15:13-14**). The jurisdiction of God extends over all territories in heaven and on earth (**Micah 6:8**).
- By practising righteousness and justice, we provide a foundation for the throne of God to be established in our lives. Once His throne is established, His rule takes effect, and the days of heaven become our experience.
- The practical application of justice begins with a profound awareness of accountability before God. We must remember that a day is coming when He will bring every work into judgement, whether good or evil (**Ecclesiastes 12:13-14, 2 Corinthians 5:10, Daniel 7:9-10, Revelation 20:11-12**).
- Second, living with the consciousness of God's judgement should lead you to regularly examine your own life with honesty and humility. Consistent self-examination helps align your conduct with God's standards (**1 Corinthians 11:31, Romans 2:1-3**).
- Third, practise justice in your sphere of influence. Stand firmly for what is right, learn to do good, pursue justice, resist oppression, defend the fatherless, and advocate for the widow. In all things, extend mercy and forgiveness to others (**Isaiah 1:17, Matthew 5:7, Colossians 4:1**).
- Fourth, preach the Word with the consciousness that the

reality of God's judgement compels men to respond. In this way, you also become a vessel through which His righteousness is dispensed.

- Fifth, embrace the ministry of intercession.
- We must become a people who continually practise the foundational attributes of God's throne. In doing so, we create a lasting place for the throne of heaven to be established in our hearts.



### PRAYER POINTS

1. Lord, establish Your righteousness and justice as the foundation of my life, so I can consistently live under the rule of Your throne.
2. Father, align my understanding and conduct with Your Word, correcting every error and building my life on Your truth.
3. Help me not only to confess righteousness in Christ but to live it daily, expressing holiness and genuine love in all I do.
4. Lord, give me a strong sense of accountability before You, guiding me to walk in justice, mercy, and integrity in every sphere of influence.
5. Make me a faithful vessel of Your kingdom – bold in proclaiming Your Word and steadfast in intercession, so that Your rule is established through my life.
